Minutes:

- Opening and welcome by [Zeki Erkin]
- [MW] suggested to discuss the issue around IEEE TIFS. There is a significant backlog (60-70 papers) in the system that have been there for a year or so.
 - TC members are invited to help with the backlog. This is voluntary based work. [ZE] This can be a one-time help.
 - [MB] A mechanism should be established not to have such a situation again.
 - [MW] There should be a list of emergency reviewers in the TC to be used as a last resort.
 - [MW-MB] A liaison from TC should be appointed to the management (Currently AV is deputy EiC) to keep the organic connection between TIFS and IFS TC, EiC should be a member of the TC automatically. [Note by ZE:] Bylaw





says TC is responsible to suggest AE to the EiC but I think this is not practices at the moment and not enough to secure the connection.

- [MW-BM]: New members should be also considered based on EDICS of the journal and keep a few positions for new areas such as Hardware and Network Security.
- [MW] suggested to have new members from emerging topics but only promote them to the voting members when they fulfil their task properly: reviews for ICASSP, ICIP, WIFS and TIFS(emergency) and active role in the TC including participation in the TC meetings (WIFS and ICASSP).
- [ZE] summarized the ICASSP review timeline (see slides).
 - Workshop and challenge sub-committee should propose some challenges for ICASSP
 - 3 yearlong challenges (3 editions with fixed deadlines) are on the table.
- Organizers of WIFS 2023 were absent. No update.
- WIFS 2024, two candidates:
 - Rome: [EM] was suggested to involve more diverse people in the committee.
 - Perth: [JS] advised to propose the next year. [Update: JS will proceed]
- Nominations and Elections Sub-committee should start with the preparations for
 - Electing 13 new members
 - Vice-chair to be chair in Jan 2025.
- [Associate members] are asked to help us to identify young and ambitious candidates.
- Award committee was advised to start the nomination period. All TC members are invited to identify candidates.
 - \circ 25 awards in total: our TC is expected to nominate at least **two** awards.
- Monthly webinars are yet to start again. [JD] is charge. All members are invited to give a webinar and/or suggest names to [JD]
 - MB is positive to give a webinar in November 2023.
 - FPG is positive.
 - ZE is also available for a webinar.
- Our TC webpage is not up to date.
 - Sub-committees are old
 - [BT] Area chairs are not there (Note: ZE will investigate this with AV)
 - Advise to the web and publicity sub-committee to be more active.
- Inviting accepted papers of WIFS to submit their extended work to Eurasip JIS to increase the submissions on both sides.
 - Not supported by the TC members
 - Organizing a special session is the best approach: one or two core topics to have more papers.
 - TC members should actively support WIFS to increase the number of submissions:
 - Participation,





- Submitting papers,
- Proposing special sessions.
- Active participation of the TC members was discussed.
 - o [ZE] mentioned the followings.
 - 6-7 people did not vote for the nominations
 - 20 people did not attend the current TC meeting without informing the chair, even though it was a hybrid meeting.
 - [BT] mentioned that some TC members did not review ICASSP papers, creating big problem.
 - [MB] mentioned the bylaws about responsibilities of the TC members and consequences of not fulfilling their task.
 - [CG] mentioned that she does not know the responsibilities of the TC members. [ZE] mentioned that it was summarized in the email from January 2023. Nevertheless, it is written in the bylaws and SPS policies and Procedures.

 - 4. Scope of Activities:

The Technical Committee shall promote activities within its areas of technical interest and shall provide expertise and assistance as follows:

(a) Assist in the review of papers within the IFS-TC scope that are submitted to Society conferences and journals;

(b) Organize and operate, which includes oversight of the technical program, societysponsored/co-sponsored symposia, seminars, and workshops, or special sessions at technical meetings of the Society or of the IEEE, at all levels, and at meetings of other organizations having cooperative relationships with the Society, in accordance with IEEE rules and procedures and the rules for such meetings;

(c) Make nominations in the SPS Society awards and vet nominations for technical excellence as requested by the Awards Board;

(d) Assist in selection of SPS Distinguished Lecturers;

(e) Assist Editors-in-Chief in identifying appropriate Associate Editors in IFS areas;

(f) Assist in the development of appropriate IEEE standards within scope, according to the rules and procedures of the IEEE;

(g) Engage with Society members who are interested in the Technical Committee's scope and be involved in the organization of regional activities;





(h) Assist SPS to explore cooperative relationship with other societies of shared technical interests, and act as SPS liaison in these collaborations and outreach.

- IFS-TC Policy: Other duties of membership include: attending TC meetings at ICASSP and WIFS workshops, and participating in election of new members and Chair, voting on the nominations for Society awards, and selection of WIFS workshop venues.
- Each elected Member is expected to carry out the following duties: assist in reviewing IFS papers submitted at ICASSP, ICIP, and WIFS; vote on TC matters and relevant ballots e.g. awards and elections; attend TC meetings; promote IFS activities.
