

## Call for Proposals

The Signal Processing Theory and Methods (SPTM) Technical Committee (TC) of the IEEE Signal Processing Society (IEEE-SPS), which is the organizer of the IEEE Statistical Signal Processing Workshop (SSP), is soliciting proposals from researchers interested in organizing the 2022 SSP Workshop. The deadline for submission of proposals is February 29, 2020. The SSP Workshop is a four-day event, and usually includes plenaries.

The proposals will be reviewed by SPTM TC and proposal finalists will be invited to present at ICASSP 2020, to be held from May 4-8 in Barcelona, Spain.

Proposing teams are asked to create a proposal according to the following outline:

1. Location and Venue – Proposals should consider the accessibility of workshop location. The characteristics of the venue and costs associated should be included in the proposal. Inclusion of a preliminary budget is highly encouraged.
2. Conference Dates – Ensure they do not conflict with major holidays, or other SPS conferences and workshops. Typically, the workshop is held during the period of mid-June to mid-July.
3. Organizing Committee Members – Build the organizing committee considering the following representation: active SPS members; diversity including geographical, industry and academia, age, and gender; conference and/or workshop experience. The participation of SPTM members is highly advisable.
4. Technical Program – Consider the overall structure and conference model. The proponents are encouraged to include plenary talks in the planned technical program.
5. Hotels
6. Travel, visas, and transportation
7. Any other relevant information
